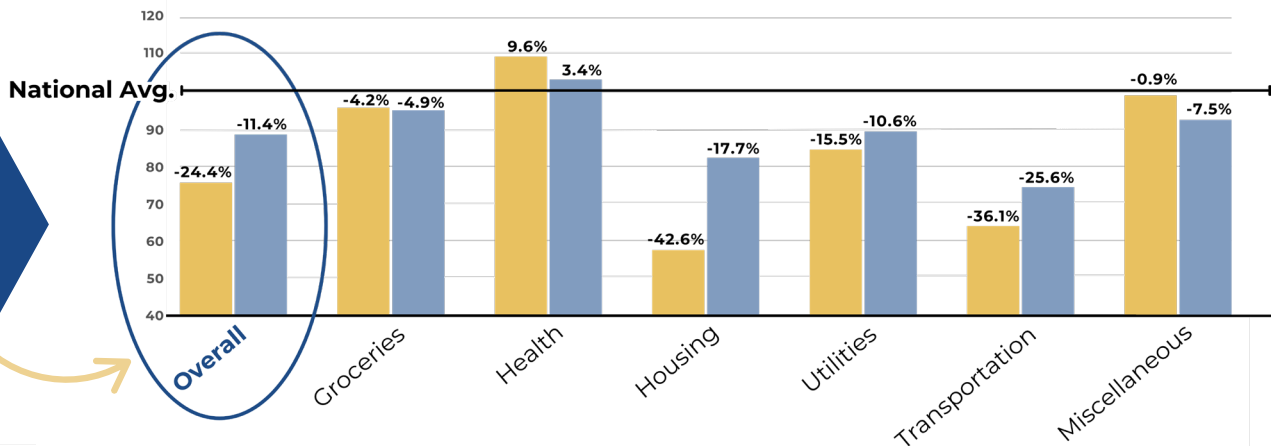

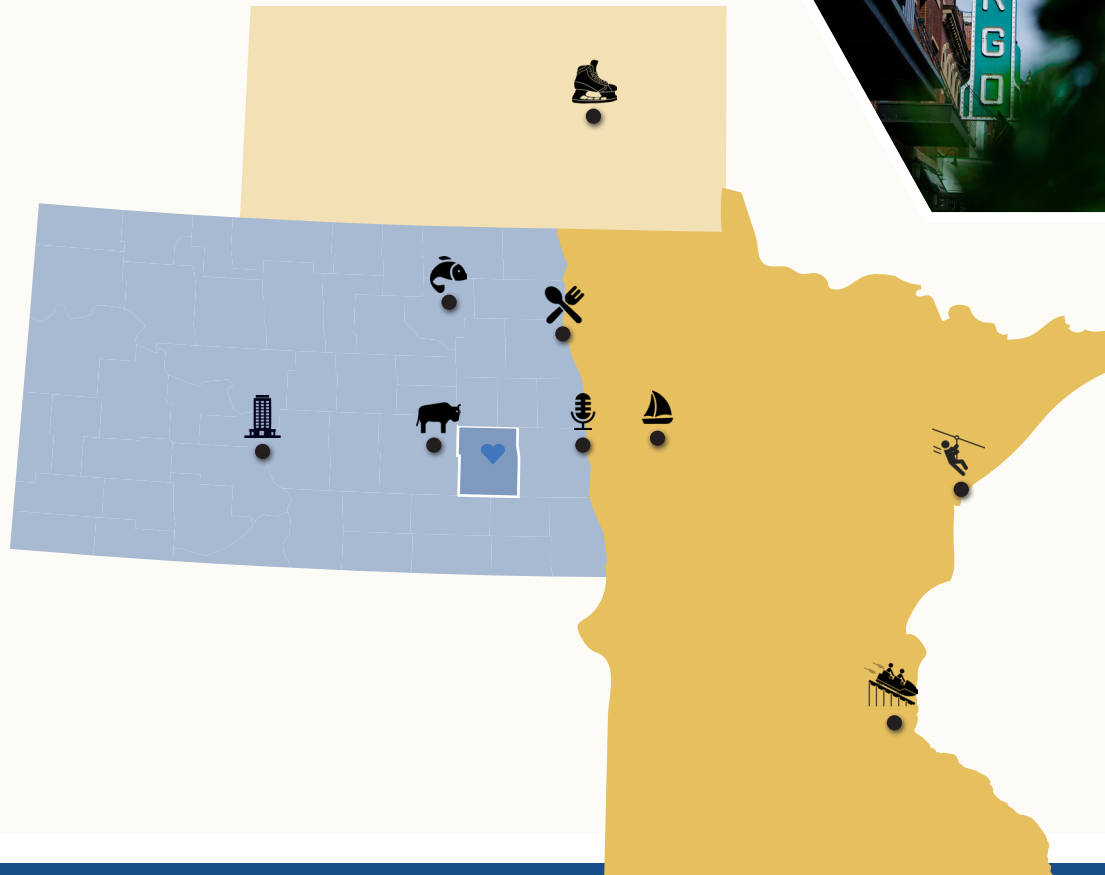

Medora, 3 hr 49 min (266.2 mi)

Cottonwood Cider House - Ayr, ND, 38 min (35 mi)

Featuring over 2,000 apple and cherry trees in 40 varieties, this mixed fruit orchard creates unique ciders for the tasting. Roam the orchard to take in the wildflowers, prairie grasses, and wildlife before heading into the taproom for cider and delicious eats.

Cows and Co. Creamery - Carrington, ND, 1 hr 18 min (80.1 mi)

A quick day trip that lets you experience the tranquility of the Netherlands. This unique farmstead is home to The Milkhouse, a storefront to pick up hand-crafted cheeses and other products, as well as the Creamery Cafe, featuring creamy, dreamy goodies and rich coffee.

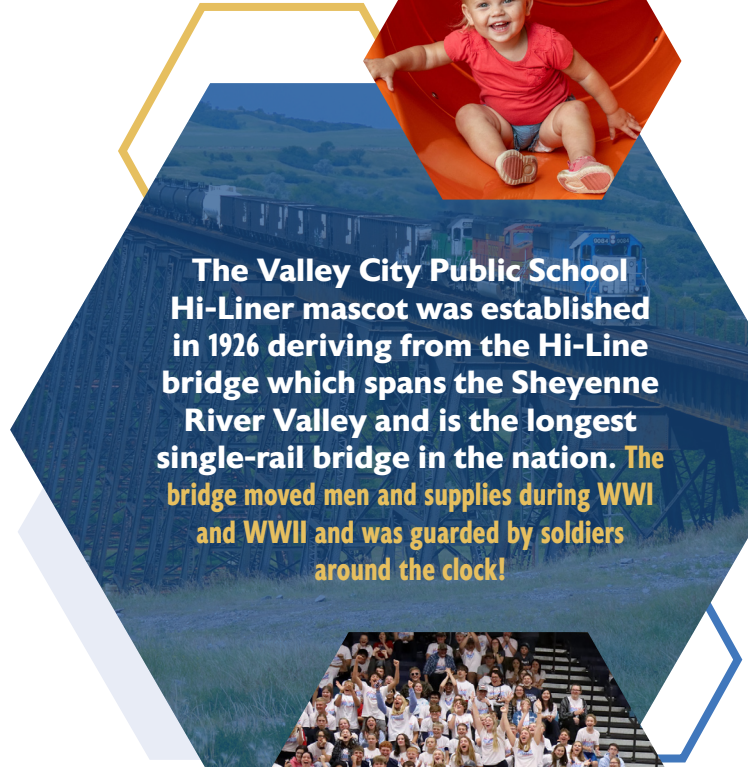
Small Schools Cultivating Big Success

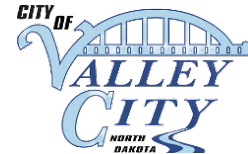
